

Lightning Policy

City of Gainesville pools use a lightning detection service to monitor severe weather. When there is lightning within 20 miles of the facility staff will inform patrons of the inclement weather before they pay the entrance fee, and remind them that there will be no refunds.

A **lightning warning** is received when there is lightning within 10 miles of the facility; staff are required to close

due to severe weather in the area. Patrons will be cleared from the pool deck and shower use will be prohibited.

An **all clear** notification is received once severe weather has left the area. At this time, staff will reopen and resume operating hours.

Weather information provided by the alert system supersedes all other weather information sources.







- 10. Fishing (except at Palm Point Nature Park and Colclough Pond Nature Park)
- 11. Hiking or biking outside of designated trails, established roads and firebreaks
- 12. Swimming and water access (except at pools and splash pads)
- 13. Horseback riding (only permitted from the north parking area of Boulware Springs Nature Park to the Gainesville-Hawthorne State Trail)
- 14. Weapons, explosives or destructive devices
- 15. Smoking or Illegal drugs
- 16. Operating or parking any motorized vehicles
- 17. Using public restrooms to shave and/or shower

Requests must be made at least seven days in advance. Applications may be submitted up to one year in advance. Please allow 72 hours for a response.

Pavilion A and B are available to rent for private events of fewer than 25 people per pavilion. If you wish to accommodate more than 25 people, please rent both Pavilion A and Pavilion B. If your event is open to the public, please complete a special event application.

Special Events Permits

Events bring our neighbors together. They help build a sense of belonging and community. Certain events require a special events permit. Special events include, but are not limited to, activities such as festivals, concerts, sporting events, parades, walks and runs. If you plan to use city streets or sidewalks, are requesting a noise permit, security or food vendors you must complete a special event permit application. For a complete list of activities that require a permit, see gainesvillefl.gov/SpecialEvent.

It takes three to four weeks to review and process a permit application once submitted. Some park venues require a reservation a minimum of 60 days in advance. We encourage you to apply for a permit as early as possible. This allows time to schedule inspections or site visits and to promote the event.

How to Host A Special Event

Apply: Fill out the Special Events Permit application form at gainesvillefl.gov/SpecialEvent

Approval: The special event coordinator will route your application for review and approvals. Sometimes, you will be asked to provide more information or to tweak your plans to ensure a safe event. Once you pay your fees, you will be given your permit number.

Event: Have an amazing event! All your hard work and planning pays off. Give yourself a pat on the back for a job well done.

Settle: After your event, it's time to settle up. If there are any outstanding balances, you will be sent an invoice for payment. Then start thinking about the next event you'd like to host!

How much does a special event permit cost?

The base fee for a special event permit is \$67. Additional services may be applicable based on the activities at your event. Below is a sample of popular activity fees. Please refer to the Code of Ordinances Appendix A for all current fees. Each event will vary depending on the unique needs of the event.

Designed for Boundless Play

The Albert "Ray" Massey playground is Gainesville's first "boundless" or fully inclusive playground that enables access for all ages and abilities. Its largest play feature, the "Space Station," is designed with ramps and flat surfaces so that visitors requiring mobility supports, such as crutches or wheelchairs, may easily maneuver throughout the sprawling structure.

The swings, slides and spinners are designed for care providers to more easily assist those with varying levels of mobility. A colorful walkway at the south end of the playground features activity boards to help develop fine-motor skills. A variety of physical, social and sensory elements were also incorporated into the design, including a communication board to support the communication needs of visitors with differing abilities.

The Albert "Ray" Massey Park playground also is the city's first fully lighted playground enabling visitors to use the play area after sunset in seasons with fewer daylight hours.
