#### **Cold Weather Policy**

During winter months, the city covers the pools with thermal blankets to help retain heat and conserve energy. The covers are usually taken off the pool each morning at opening. If the temperature is 32°F or below staff will not take the covers off the pool, delaying the opening of the pool until the temperature reaches at least 33°F. If forecasts call for freezing conditions staff may announce a delayed opening in advance. Ask staff at the pools how to receive notifications about pool updates.

#### **Season Pool Passes**

Seasonal pool passes are valid for six months from the date of purchase and may be used for admission to any city pool. Please note that Mickle Pool is not a year-round pool. Dwight H. Hunter and H. Spurgeon Cherry are open year-round.



# A. Quinn Jones Museum & Cultural Center

The A. Quinn Jones Museum & Cultural Center, housed in the former Jones homestead at 1013 NW Seventh Ave. in Gainesville, serves as a tribute to one of Gainesville's most influential educators in the history of Alachua County. The museum features a permanent exhibit on "Prof Jones," the people and places of Fifth Avenue/Pleasant Street Historic District. The U.S. Secretary of Interior listed the house on the National Registry of Historic Places in 2010. The museum houses a collection of oral histories and rotating exhibits. It also features live music, art, workshops and lectures.



- 10. Fishing (except at Palm Point Nature Park and Colclough Pond Nature Park)
- 11. Hiking or biking outside of designated trails, established roads and firebreaks
- 12. Swimming and water access (except at pools and splash pads)
- 13. Horseback riding (only permitted from the north parking area of Boulware Springs Nature Park to the Gainesville-Hawthorne State Trail)
- 14. Weapons, explosives or destructive devices
- 15. Smoking or Illegal drugs
- 16. Operating or parking any motorized vehicles
- 17. Using public restrooms to shave and/or shower
- 18. Bathing in a water or drinking fountain
- 19. Overnight use

# **Special Events Permits**

Events bring our neighbors together. They help build a sense of belonging and community. Certain events require a special events permit. Special events include, but are not limited to, activities such as festivals, concerts, sporting events, parades, walks and runs. If you plan to use city streets or sidewalks, are requesting a noise permit, security or food vendors you must complete a special event permit application. For a complete list of activities that require a permit, see gainesvillefl.gov/SpecialEvent.

It takes three to four weeks to review and process a permit application once submitted. Some park venues require a reservation a minimum of 60 days in advance. We encourage you to apply for a permit as early as possible. This allows time to schedule inspections or site visits and to promote the event.

#### **How to Host A Special Event**

Apply: Fill out the Special Events Permit application form at gainesvillefl.gov/SpecialEvent

**Approval:** The special event coordinator will route your application for review and approvals. Sometimes, you will be asked to provide more information or to tweak your plans to ensure a safe event. Once you pay your fees, you will be given your permit number.

**Event:** Have an amazing event! All your hard work and planning pays off. Give yourself a pat on the back for a job well done.

**Settle:** After your event, it's time to settle up. If there are any outstanding balances, you will be sent an invoice for payment. Then start thinking about the next event you'd like to host!

#### How much does a special event permit cost?

The base fee for a special event permit is \$67. Additional services may be applicable based on the activities at your event. Below is a sample of popular activity fees. Reserve Park honors service members from all branches of the military and their families. An original sculpture and service flags line the Eighth Avenue entry, while a fenced community garden with fruit trees and a garden shed sits at the park's 11th Street entry. Other amenities within the park include modern play equipment, traveling rings, an obstacle course, a pavilion, benches, picnic tables, grills, a walking path, open green space and landscaping with extensive tree and shrub plantings.

Reserve Park was built on the property that was once the C. R. Layton United States Army Reserve Center; the property was transformed into a neighborhood park in 2019. The 257th Movement Control Battalion – known as the Movers and Shakers – occupied this 6.8-acre site for nearly 60 years, from 1951 until 2009.

The Reserve Park project was funded through the Wild Spaces & Public Places half-cent sales tax, Reserve Park CIP fund and tree mitigation funding to support additional tree plantings in the park.

Construction completed in January of 2020.
