Unlike the traditional linear economy, which follows a "take-make-waste" model, a circular economy aims to create a closed-loop system where the materials that make our items are continuously repurposed, refurbished, or recycled. By doing so, the need for raw materials is reduced, lowering the environmental footprint of manufacturing and consumption.



How to Participate

1. **Choose Products with Minimal Packaging:** Opt for items that are package free. If that's not an option, choose items in reusable, recyclable, or compostable packaging.
2. **Support Second-Hand Markets:** Buying or donating items to thrift stores or participating in swap events helps extend the life cycle of products. Gainesville businesses have made great strides to build a more robust circular economy.
3. **Repair, Don't Replace:** Whenever possible, repair broken items instead of replacing them. This reduces waste and encourages the design of more durable products.
