Parking Garage Terms & Conditions

SW DOWNTOWN PARKING GARAGE POLICY

Permits are Non-Refundable.

It is my responsibility to purchase/renew my permit before expiration. I understand that the permit is valid only for the period of use purchased. Failure to pay the fee by the due/expiration date may result in immediate deactivation of the permit and citation enforcement.

It is my responsibility to enter my information correctly in the application, including the vehicle's license plate number. Plate number should be entered exactly as it reads, with only letters and numbers, no spaces or special characters.

- The letter O is not used in license plates a zero (0) should be used instead.
- 1, I, L: I'll be sure to distinguish between the number one (1) and the letters I and L

If I have a parking permit directly with another entity that in turn has parking rights in the parking garage, I still agree to be bound by items listed herein, as well as the rules set forth in/by my parking permit/agreement to the extent such rules do not conflict with those herein.

I may list two vehicles on my permit but ONLY ONE will be allowed in the parking garage at any given time under the permit.

The City of Gainesville assumes no responsibility for damages, theft or personal injury while at the SW Downtown Parking Garage.

Users with paid permits will have unlimited access to the garage 24/7, unless you have a parking permit directly with another entity that in turn has parking rights in the parking garage and your parking permit/agreement stipulates differently.

I understand I may park in any space that is not time limited or reserved for another entity or purpose as designated by marking/signage.

The following are **expressly prohibited** in the parking garage and may be subject to citation enforcement, permit revocation or trespassing issuance:

- Backed-in parking
- Parties or loitering
- Alcohol use, drug use and smoking
- Sleeping overnight
- Storing a vehicle with an expired license tag or that is inoperable
- Littering or discarding of waste other than in trash receptacles
- Skateboarding, roller skating/blading, scooter riding, bicycle riding
- Fighting, arguing or exhibiting confrontational behavior
- Playing loud music, revving up engine or other noise concerns
- Speeding or reckless driving
- Vehicle cleaning using liquids, water, chemicals or other cleaning products
- Public urination or other personal misconduct as determined by Parking Operations
